As a child, Fr. Liborio Amaral was no stranger to the priesthood. His uncle and godfather, Fr. Liborio Tavares, would spend his day off from parish life at Fr. Amaral's home.

Each week, his uncle would recount events he had experienced since his last visit: baptisms, hospital visits, funerals. Through it all, "there was always a smile on his face and joy in his heart," Fr. Amaral remembers. In his uncle, Fr. Amaral saw a man who had no wife or kids, yet was still extremely joyful. This attitude was contagious. Years later, when Fr. Amaral began discerning the priesthood, those moments of his uncle's joy and fulfillment served as a great encouragement to him.

"He didn't push the priesthood on me," Fr. Amaral said. "He allowed God's hand to guide me." Soon after entering the seminary, he could sense the joy and pride that Fr. Tavares had in witnessing his godson follow a call to the priesthood.

Currently, Fr. Amaral is the pastor at St. Mary's Parish in Brampton. His parents have attended this parish for over 40 years. Fr. Tavares has retired to a home down the road. In his retirement, he is able to spend a great deal of time ministering alongside his nephew, without the



responsibilities of parish administration. He helps with morning Masses, confessions and other priestly duties. Fr. Tavares' witness continues to influence the life of his nephew by emphasizing an important aspect of their shared vocation.

Ways of Giving to The Shepherds' Trust

There are various ways of making gifts to The Shepherds' Trust, each method offering tax benefits that may significantly reduce the cost of your gift.

1. Gifts of Cash

By far the most popular method of support, a gift of cash provides an immediate benefit to the Trust, and an instant tax receipt for you. You may receive a tax credit for a gift of up to 75% of your annual net income in any one year, and you may carry forward any excess for a period of up to five years. Spouses may combine their charitable receipts on one income tax return even if the receipts are not in both names.

Gifts of cash may be given through the parish on the weekend of November 16-17, 2013, or post-dated cheques throughout the year. Cheques should be made payable to: Parish Name – The Shepherds' Trust.

Donating online through a secure server is an option for those donors who prefer to give through our web site at www.shepherdstrust.org

2. Bequests

A bequest is a specific provision in your will, directing various estate assets to be given to The Shepherds' Trust in return for a tax receipt for the full value of the bequest. This receipt can be used to reduce the tax payable on your final tax return and on the return of the previous year up to 100% of your net income.

These gifts can symbolize permanent memorials for you, your family or anyone you wish to honour.

3. Publicly Traded Stocks and Securities

Publicly traded stocks, bonds and other securities may also be gifted to The Shepherds' Trust. The tax on capital gains on publicly traded securities gifted to registered charities has been eliminated. Thus, donors will receive a tax receipt for the full amount of their charitable gift.

Priests need priests. Fr. Ed McGovern's priestly ministry confirms this fact. His first assignment after ordination was to St. Boniface parish in Scarborough. He worked as associate pastor alongside the pastor, Fr. John Pilkauskas. Early in his assignment, he realized that in spite of his great formation in seminary, there was still much to learn from living and serving with his brother priests.

In residence with them at St. Boniface was Fr. John Bolger, a retired priest of the Archdiocese. The three men were together often, including at mealtimes. Every day, Fr. Pilkauskas showed great love and care for his retired brother with simple yet significant gestures of kindness.

It was at St. Boniface where Fr. McGovern came to know the great fraternity that exists in the Catholic priesthood. It is a brotherhood wherein members encourage and learn from one another.

Recently, Fr. McGovern was assigned to serve as chaplain at Providence Healthcare in Scarborough after serving for a number of years at St. Michael's Cathedral. In his new role, he spends time with many retired priests of the Archdiocese of Toronto who reside at the Cardinal Ambrozic Houses of Providence.

Every morning, Fr. McGovern says Mass in the Providence chapel. Concelebrating with him are retired priests who have inspired and continue to show him their holiness and joy.

Fr. McGovern's priesthood makes evident the reality that priests of all ages need one another.
